We ask that bags are left on the day of collection at drop off under the shelter by the main reception – if you can fill more than one bag, please do so! Happy School Bag will also accept donations in black refuse sacks. We regret that we cannot accept donations later than 9am on 5th November.

All money raised goes directly to FOSIS to be used for the benefit of all the children.

SEPTEMBER 2026 YEAR 3 ADMISSIONS

Applications open Friday 7th November for you to apply for a Junior School place for September 2026.

Please be aware that although we are a linked school, there is no automatic transition from Sandwich Infant School to Sandwich Junior School so all parents will need to apply for a place via the Kent County Council website.

For those wanting to attend an Open Morning at Sandwich Junior School, there will be one coming up on Wednesday 29th October at 9:30am. Historically this Open Morning was for parents only, however, you are welcome to take your child if you feel this is appropriate. It is however, really important that your child still attends the morning registration at Sandwich Infant School, so please make sure to come here first.

HOUSEKEEPING - GATES

It is important that you avoid following others into the school grounds if the gate is open as someone else is leaving the site or coming in through the gate when it is outside of pick up/drop off times. This is for safeguarding purposes as we need to know who is coming in and going off site.

We will be welcoming speakers from Cats Protection on Wednesday 15th October who will be delivering sessions to all pupils.


As Miss Hancock will be running the London marathon for Cats Protection in April, we would like to show our support by having a non-school uniform day on the last day of term (Friday 17th October).
